Barrier-free non-profit organization showcases studio artists

Young local artists from Barrier Free's Life Skills and Social Studio hosted a community art exhibition Sept. 10- 11 at the main studio in Historic Downtown Sykesville, Carroll County.

Barrier-Free is a community nonprofit service organization that provides inclusive art, self-advocacy, and social programming to adults with disabilities. It is run by Britt and Lauren Burr, who have worked for a variety of disability service organizations in Maryland.

On June 1, the organization expanded to include the Life Skills and Social Studio, where the event was held in an open-house style. A variety of original pieces were available for display and sale. All proceeds went back to the neurodiverse artists and Barrier-Free, and over \$2,000 worth of art and merchandise was sold.

A neurodiverse artist is an artist who thinks, behaves, and learns differently than what is "typical" in society. Neurodiversity

- **Eat and drink carefully.** Airlines still require masks during flight unless

you're eating or drinking. Pack snacks for specific, scheduled meal breaks to maintain consistent mask use. Fill up your water bottles before the flight and make sure they're sturdy and don't leak.

- **Explore your destination in advance.** Find out what restrictions apply in

How mulched leaves help your lawn

Various chores are synonymous with certain times of year. For example, cleaning a pool is a summertime task. In addition, rare is the instance that Mother Nature forces anyone to break out the snow shovels outside of winter. Raking leaves has long been a task for fall afternoons, but homeowners may be surprised to learn that they might be better off putting their rakes in permanent mothballs.

In the 1990s, turfgrass specialists at Michigan

State University began exploring the potential benefits of leaving mulched leaves on a lawn instead of raking them and leaving them for curbside pickup. While the researchers noticed an obvious leaf residue on the lawn after mulching, they noted that it only sticks around for a few days. Eventually, the tiny pieces sifted down into the lawn, ultimately serving to control future weed growth while also providing the lawn with essential nutri-

ents. Over time, researchers noted that homeowners who mulched rather than raked their leaves needed less fertilizer to give their lawns a green look in spring, saving homeowners the effort and cost associated with fertilizing.

Researchers also noted that decomposing pieces of leaves cover up bare spots between turf plants, which have traditionally proven to be excellent spots for weed seeds to germinate. In fact, MSU notes that homeown-

ers can expect a nearly 100 percent decrease in dandelions and crabgrass after mulching leaves for just three years.

Depending on the type of mower being used, up to six inches of leaves can be mulched at a time. Push mowers can handle smaller amounts, though can still be as effective as ride-on mowers.

Fall may be synonymous with raking leaves. However, homeowners who want to give their lawns a healthy



boost should consider putting their rakes away and mulching their leaves this fall. FH198141

Easy ways to clean up leaves

Autumn is marked by colorful foliage and plummeting temperatures. Once those leaves reach peak color, they fall from the branches and collect on lawns, necessitating cleanup projects. For homeowners with big yards, such a project can be tiring and time-consuming. However, there are ways to make leaf cleanup easier.

One of the easiest ways to clean up leaves is to reach for a lawn mower rather

than a rake. The mower will cut leaves down to smaller sizes, creating an effective mulch that can add nutrients back into the lawn. Davey, a lawn and landscape solutions service, says that mowed leaves also can be collected in a mower bag and added to garden beds or compost piles.

For those who prefer manual raking, select a rake with tines that will not skewer the leaves in the

process. Big rakes also can make faster work of gathering leaves into piles.

The home improvement resource The Family Handyman advocates for the use of a lawn sweeper. This is a manual device that has a rotating sweeping brush that gathers up lawn debris and leaves into an attached hopper bag. Like mowed leaves, the bag can be emptied into

backup electrical systems that operate automatically. Once the generator senses a power loss, which can occur within seconds of a utility outage, its automatic transfer switch essentially gives the generator a wakeup call, commanding it to begin supplying power to the circuits in a home.

Some transfer switches may be automated, requiring no effort on the part

of homeowners when the power goes out. Others may need to be flipped on like one might flip a light switch. Seniors and/or people with mobility issues may benefit from standby generators with automated transfer switches, as they may find it difficult to manually turn the switches themselves. That's especially true if the power goes out overnight, when visibility inside a home with

no power is compromised.

Standby generators are typically connected to the circuits throughout a home, which means they can kick in and run HVAC systems, refrigerators and security systems, among other devices. That helps people

stay comfortable and sleep well during power outages, while also ensuring they won't have to throw away any groceries or spend times in their homes without functioning security systems.

Standby generators can help people prepare for and

overcome storms and natural disasters, making them an invaluable addition to any home. TF201602

Check Your Smoke Detector

Check your smoke detector at least once every six months, if not more frequently. It might not be working. Although the average life of a smoke detector can span as long as 10 to 15 years, the devices can go on the blink, and you wouldn't know it. About 30 percent of smoke detectors fail after 10 years, according to a recent report. And about 50 percent of them shut down after 15 years. Though it might emit a sound when you test it, that doesn't necessarily mean it will alert you to smoke or fire.



a compost pile or distributed where needed.

Raking leaves onto a large tarp is another option. Once it's full, the tarp can be taken to the curb where many towns will collect the leaves seasonally. Otherwise, the tarp can be used as a funnel to put leaves into a gardening bag or another appropriate receptacle.

Leaf blowers remain a fast option for cleaning up yards, but they require electricity or gas and can be noisy. Still, they are a popular choice for large landscapes or when quick work needs to be made of leaf clean-up.

Leaves will fall in autumn, but luckily homeowners have various methods at their disposal to tame the mess. FH198139

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. In a large bowl cream together butter and sugars until light and fluffy. Beat in the egg and vanilla extract. Combine together: flour, cinnamon, baking soda and salt. Gradually add to creamed mixture, mixing well. Stir in the oats and chopped apples.

Drop onto parchment lined baking sheets with a small cookie scoop, 2 inches apart. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes, until golden brown in color. Cool on wire rack. Store in an airtight container after completely cooled. Makes 2 dozen cookies.

Apple Cinnamon Cake

- 1 1/2 Cups All-purpose Flour
- 2 tsp. Baking Powder
- 1/2 tsp. Baking Soda
- 3/4 Cup Granulated Sugar
- 1 Large Red Apple (1 cup, peeled, chopped)
- 2 Large Eggs
- 1 tsp. Vanilla Extract
- 1/2 Cup Vegetable Oil
- 1/2 Cup Greek yogurt



- Cinnamon Topping:**
- 1/4 Cup Granulated Sugar
 - 1 tsp. Ground Cinnamon
 - 1 Tbsp. Butter (melted)

- Sugar Glaze:**
- 1/4 Cup Powdered Sugar (10x)
 - 1 to 2 Tbsp. Milk

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Grease and line an 8 or 9 inch baking pan with parchment paper.

In a large mixing bowl, add the flour, baking powder, baking soda and sugar. Add the chopped apple and stir briefly to combine.

In a separate bowl, add the eggs, vanilla, oil and yogurt. Whisk briefly just to break up the egg yolk. Add the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients and gently mix with a wooden spoon until combined, be careful not to over mix. Spoon batter into prepared pan.

To make the cinnamon topping, combine cinnamon, sugar and butter. Mix together until lumpy and wet. Sprinkle over top of batter. Bake cake for 30 to 35 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

To make the glaze, mix together the sugar and 1 tablespoon of milk. Stir until smooth. If the glaze is too thick add an extra tablespoon of milk. Drizzle glaze over top of cooled cake. Serves 8.

encompasses a variety of neurological differences that stray away from neurotypical standards.

"Our talented artists have worked tirelessly to bring this event to life," said Lauren Burr, executive director of Barrier-Free. "The art gallery event was amazing! Every artist sold a piece of their work. One artist sold over 44 pieces of origami. Other artists sold art depicting their favorite cartoons and landscapes, while some sold poetry and clay creations."

Creative Director Britt Burr explained this event was independently-planned and executed by the participants, with oversight and guidance from Barrier-Free. The group had gallery rehears-

als in which they practiced where and how each person would be stationed at The Art Gallery. This helped to ease any anxieties and pressures about public speaking or about spatial orientation at the event. There were greeters, check-out attendants, servers, and those who mingled in the crowd. This ensured everyone had a role and each role addressed a specific task.



Most Americans Are Unaware of Key Cancer Risk Factors

(NAPSI)—The majority of Americans are unaware of several major risk factors for cancer—most notably obesity, which will soon overtake smoking as the largest preventable cause of cancer in the United States. This is one of the many findings from the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO)'s National Cancer Opinion Survey.

Less than a third of Americans (31 percent) realize that obesity is a risk factor for cancer, even though it is currently the second leading preventable cause of the disease. In fact, a higher body mass index is associated with increased risk of a number of cancers, including colon, breast, high-grade prostate, and uterine cancers. According to a recent analysis by the National Cancer Institute, if the current rates of obesity continue to trend upward, by 2030 there could be about 500,000 additional cases of cancer in the United States than would otherwise be expected.

"Our lifestyles have a big impact on our risk of developing many common cancers," said ASCO Chief Medical Officer Richard Schilsky, M.D., FACP, FASCO. "That so few Americans are aware that maintaining a healthy weight is associated with

lower risk for many cancers should serve as a wake-up call. Unfortunately, obesity is a problem that cannot be solved overnight and will require broad societal engagement to address."

The survey also found that few Americans are aware of other lifestyle factors that increase their cancer risk. For example, less than one in three Americans (30 percent) recognize alcohol as a risk factor for cancer, despite the fact that alcohol consumption can raise the risk of certain cancers, including cancers of the mouth, liver and breast. By contrast, a majority of Americans correctly identify tobacco use (78 percent) and sun exposure (66 percent) as risk factors for cancer.

In addition, some misperceptions about cancer risk persist: Fourteen percent of Americans incorrectly identify cell phones as increasing the risk of cancer, and 8 percent incorrectly identify caffeine as a risk factor for cancer.

At the same time, the majority of Americans are not taking some important preventive actions to reduce their cancer risk. Only 48 percent say they use sunblock or limit their exposure to the sun; 41 percent say they maintain a healthy weight; and 38 percent say they limit alcohol consumption in order to prevent cancer.

The nationally represen-

tative survey on Americans' attitudes about cancer was commissioned by ASCO and conducted online by Harris Poll from July 10–18, 2017, among 4,016 U.S. adults ages 18 and older.

"This research helps us understand what our fellow Americans know and believe about cancer, and therefore where we need to focus as a nation in our efforts to conquer cancer," said ASCO President Bruce Johnson, M.D., FASCO. "It is clear there are many important gaps we need to address—from educating the public about cancer prevention, to confronting high treatment costs, to investing in cancer research that is vital to improving patients' outcomes in the future."

The survey also shows that overall, Americans are optimistic about the future of cancer treatment and expect there to be a steady pace of progress over the coming decades. Nearly four in five Americans (79 percent) believe that the majority of cancers will be curable within the next 50 years, compared to 66 percent who think most cancers will be curable within the next 25 years, and 39 percent who believe most cancers will be curable within the next 10 years.

Homebuyers Urged to Request Property's Claims History

Acting Insurance Commissioner Jessica Altman has released a brochure helping consumers learn how to access what is known as the CLUE report, showing previous claims filed against a property a homebuyer is considering buying to make sure claims are disclosed and that homeowners insurance rates are set using accurate information.

"I'm encouraging homebuyers to get a CLUE, and ask the current homeowner to request a copy of the CLUE report, which stands for Comprehensive Loss Underwriting Exchange, and lists any claims filed on the property for the past seven years," Acting Commissioner Altman told a first-time homebuyers' workshop conducted in Scranton. "The CLUE report will help ensure homebuyers are aware of this vital information before they decide to purchase a property."

The CLUE report includes information on the date of any specific damages, the type of claim filed by the policyholder, and how much money was paid by the insurance company over the past seven years. This is important information for a homebuyer as past claims may reveal a problem with the property, and revealing any past problems and claims is a requirement for the home seller.

Information on past claims and damages may also be used by insurers to

set homeowners insurance premiums for the property, so it is important buyers make sure insurers are using accurate information to determine rates.

Only the owner of a property can order a CLUE report, so a homebuyer must ask the seller to get this report. Consumers get one free report a year under the Fair Credit Reporting Act.

"There are many instances in which the seller has not owned or lived in the home for seven years, and so may not be aware of all claims filed during that period," Acting Commissioner Altman said. "Home sellers also benefit from having this report to ensure proper disclosure and avoid claims of fraud, negligent misrepresentation, or breach of contract, and to make certain the information is accurate."

CLUE reports are owned and maintained by Lexis-Nexis Risk Solutions. This information source is used by most insurers to report and check the claims history of a home. A homeowner can request a report at personalreports.lexisnexis.com, or by calling 1-866-312-8076. It takes seven to ten days for a report to arrive by mail; three days by email.

Consumers with any insurance questions or complaints can contact the Insurance Department at www.insurance.pa.gov, or by calling the Consumer Services Bureau at 1-877-881-6388.



Résumé writing rules to follow

When professionals are ready to take a new step in their careers, it's wise to revisit their old résumés and see what can be done to update them for the current day and age. This is especially true for people who may have been out of the job-seeking arena for some time.

Writing a résumé can be complicated. The rules for finding a new job are continually evolving, and

résumés remain a big component of that process. The following are some current résumé trends that will help professionals stand out from the masses.

- **Consider design.** De-

sign your résumé so it will look good whether it's viewed on a screen or a mobile phone or printed on paper. Classic serif style fonts can make a résumé seem dated, so select mod-

ern fonts that are crisp. The idea is for the résumé to look balanced and clear, without being overdone with modifications, like italics and bold lettering. However, a spot of color could provide much-needed attention.

- **Be brief yet effective.** A concise design is key. Many recruiters spend little to no time reviewing the hordes of résumés they receive. In fact, automated résumé bots may initially screen the documents to thin the crowd. According to data from the 12th annual Mystery Job Candidate survey by CareerXRoads, the average recruiter spends six seconds looking at a résumé. If a résumé is lengthy or doesn't attract attention, it will likely be ignored. Stick to a single-page and make sure wording is brief but meaty.

- **Keep juicy details up top.** Format the résumé so the most pertinent information is within the top one-third of the document. Beef up a summary statement and use it in lieu of an objective. Make sure that summary includes keywords that promote your skills and experience to potentially lure the recruiter into reading more.

- **Tweak job titles.** Mimic phrasing from the job listing to beat the bots and get résumés flagged for review. Slightly change job position titles so they mirror the wording used. For example, if a recruiter is looking for a "financial account manager," and you have the experience, list your title as something like "Senior manager of new financial accounts."

- **Who you know.** Landing a new job is often about what you know, but getting a foot in the door is also largely influenced by who you know. Include any professional groups to which you belong or alumni associations. Who knows? The recruiter may have the same alma mater, and you can bond over your shared mascot.

Keywords, phrasing, formatting, and having the right skills for the job can ensure a résumé is seen by a recruiter, and perhaps even lead to a new career. TF189303



Auction Terms

Absentee Bid

A procedure which allows a bidder to participate in the bidding process without being physically present. Generally, a bidder submits an offer on an item prior to the auction. Absentee bids are usually handled under an established set of guidelines by the auctioneer or his representative. The particular rules and procedures of absentee bids are unique to each auction company.

Reserve Auction

An auction in which the seller reserves the right to establish a reserve price, to accept or decline any and all bids or to withdraw the property at any time prior to the announcement of the completion of the sale by the auctioneer.

Bidder's Choice

A method of sale whereby the successful high bidder wins the right to choose a property or properties from a grouping of similar or like-kind properties. After the high bidder's selection, the property is deleted from the group, and the second round of bidding commences, with the high bidder in round two choosing a property, which is then deleted from the group and so on, until all properties are sold.

Tax Sale

Public sale of property at auction by governmental authority, due to nonpayment of property taxes.

Agent

A person who acts for or in the place of another individual or entity by authority from them.

Conditions of Sale

The legal terms that govern the conduct of an auction, including acceptable methods of payment, terms, buyer's premiums, possession, reserves and any other limiting factors of an auction. Usually included in published advertisements or announced by the auctioneer prior to the start of the auction.

Caravan Auctions

A series of on site auctions advertised through a common promotional campaign.

Bookkeeper or Clerk

The person who is responsible for the accounting and paperwork at an auction sale.
